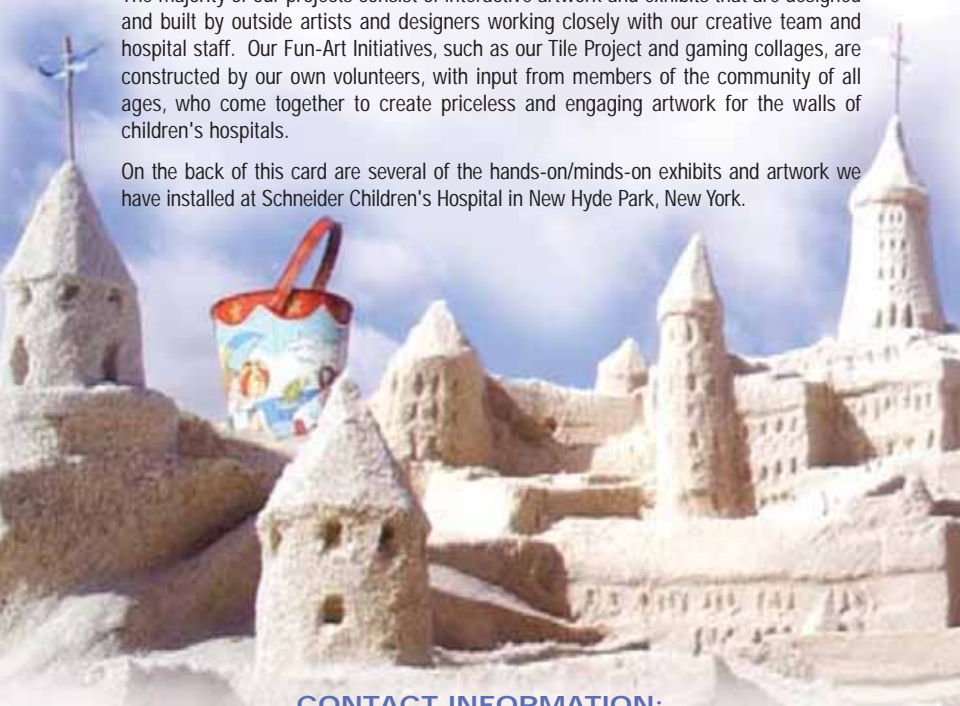

### COMPUTER KIOSKS.

To date, we have installed nine multi-unit and single-unit Computer Kiosks, incorporating the creative and unique Kaleidodraw, Sandy Art and Doll House software programs developed by Protozone Inc.

### AQUA CIRCUS.

Two Aqua Circus virtual waterless aquariums have been installed in the main lobby seating area of the hospital. Each unit has a wide variety of interactive controls on all sides that allow multiple participants to simultaneously maneuver the inhabitants of the tanks by pushing buttons, moving levers, manipulating cranks and more.



### SELF-PORTRAIT TILE PROJECT.

Each of these lovingly created portraits expresses the individuality of its artist and is filled with vibrant colors and warm happy faces. More than 400 Self-Portrait's have been framed and permanently mounted onto the walls of Schneider Children's Hospital and Schneider Children's Hospital's North Shore University Hospital Campus.



### SPACE WALK.

A montage of space imagery from NASA and other sources has been utilized to transform the long, well-traveled corridor connecting Long Island Jewish Hospital to Schneider Children's Hospital into a dynamic and engaging planetarium-like walkway.
